NOTICE OF AMENDMENTS TO LPC REGULATIONS, EFFECTIVE FEBRUARY 16, 2024

The Kentucky Board of Licensed Professionals Counselors recently amended several administrative regulations, which became effective February 16, 2024. Below, you will find a list highlighting certain changes and a chart summarizing the amendments. Please note that these highlights and summary charts are not comprehensive. Each licensee should take the time to review these regulations in full.

Please note the following summarizes the changes that most affect licensees. A more comprehensive chart follows this list.

201 KAR 36:030 – Continuing education requirements:

- All mandatory courses (Kentucky law, Suicide Assessment, and Domestic Violence) must be board-approved, and most exemptions have been eliminated. However, there is still an exemption for teachers of the boardapproved training.
- Updates for who may teach a mandatory course and the use of course credits.

201 KAR 36:040 - Code of Ethics

• Updated reporting requirements for criminal acts, entry of a domestic violence order, substantiated acts of child abuse and neglect or elder abuse, neglect and exploitation, and any pretrial diversion where charges are pending for a time certain with conditions that will allow dismissal if the conditions are met.

201 KAR 36:060 – Qualifying Experience

- Clarifies roles and responsibilities of the supervisor and other avenues of supervision for an LPCA.
- The supervisee's agency must provide a signed agreement to ensure access to clinical documents, among other things.
- Clarifies supervision agreement when a supervisee changes a job placement.
- Establishes additional requirements related to the supervision agreement.

201 KAR 36:065 – Supervisor:

- Clarifies the applicant for supervisory status, has no unresolved complaint, and adds a two-year restriction on supervision following any formal discipline.
- Reduces the maximum number of supervisees from 12 to 9.
- Provides clarification on reciprocity of supervisor status from other states.

201 KAR 36:070 – Applications

- Strikes requirement for KSP background check and requires all criminal background checks to be performed by the FBI. Eliminates using the Optional Affidavit for licensure in place of the FBI criminal background check.
- Removes reference to specific regional institutions associations for accreditation to clarify that the accrediting institution must be CACREP.
- Clarifies that "direct service" includes diagnosis, treatment planning, assessment, techniques, and interventions in compliance with KRS 535.525(1)(d) and (e).

Establishes additional requirements related to the supervision agreement. Requires the supervisee to assist with the execution of a signed agreement with the job placement agency to allow the supervisor to have access to the superviser's clinical records and communicate with the administrative supervisor. Clarifies there is a requirement that a new supervision agreement. Updates the form(s).
