### AGREED ORDER

The Kentucky Board of Licensed Professional Counselors (the "Board"), and Cassandra

Jones, LPCC license #262442, hereby agree as follows:

### FACTS

- On January 14, 2021, the Board received complaint number 2021-LPC-00003
  against Jones. After all parties were afforded an opportunity to respond pursuant to applicable law,
  the Board conducted an investigation. The Board's investigation into the allegations of the
  complaint substantiated the following facts.
- Jones was employed as a counselor at a healthcare facility in Burlington, Kentucky beginning in 2018. While employed at that facility, Jones primarily worked with its IOP (intensive outpatient) program.
- During their treatment in the IOP program, a client disclosed to Jones concerns that he was in an abusive domestic relationship.
- Jones' client graduated from the IOP program, and Jones left her employment with the healthcare facility in July of 2019.

- Jones' former client added Jones as a friend on Facebook and the two began communicating privately. In August of 2019, the client expressed to Jones that he had been abused and kicked out of his house and was then homeless. He sought assistance finding housing.
  - Jones and her husband were separated at that time.
- Jones developed romantic feelings for her former client and sent him images of herself of an intimate and explicit nature. Evidence did not indicate reciprocation on behalf of Jones' former client.
- Jones cut off communication with her former client in October of 2019, after reconciling with her husband.
- 9. Upon review of all available information, the Board concluded that there is substantial evidence that Jones violated several provisions of the Board's Code of Ethics, including 201 KAR 36:040 § 1(2)(b)-(d) and (j), § 2(19) and (32), and § 5(16), and that disciplinary action is merited under KRS 335.540(1)(g). Jones agrees the Board may take disciplinary action against her for the above-described violations.
- Instead of pursuing a disciplinary hearing, the parties have mutually decided to resolve any potential disciplinary action by means of this Agreed Order.

The Board and Jones now therefore agree to this Agreed Order, which resolves Complaint Number 2021-LPC-00003 on the following terms and conditions:

### **FINDINGS**

Jones admits the facts set forth herein. Jones acknowledges that the Board could find by a preponderance of the evidence that she engaged in conduct that violates the provisions of KRS 335.540(1)(g) and 201 KAR 36:040 §§ 1(2)(b)-(d) and (j), 2(19) and (32), and 5(16).

### VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS

Jones has had the opportunity at all times to seek advice concerning this matter from competent counsel of her choice. No coercion has been exerted upon Jones, nor have any promises been made other than those reflected in this Agreed Order, to induce her to execute this Agreed Order. Jones has freely and voluntarily entered into this Agreed Order, motivated only by a desire to resolve the issues addressed herein. Jones has executed this Agreed order only after a careful reading of it and a full understanding of all of its terms. Jones waives the right to challenge any term or condition of this Agreed Order notwithstanding any other statutory provision of KRS 335.500 to 335.599, or 201 KAR Chapter 36. Jones expressly agrees those terms and conditions contained therein are exclusively a matter of private right.

Jones is fully aware of her rights to contest charges in a formal hearing. Those rights include: representation by an attorney at Jones' own expense, the right to a public hearing on any charges contained in the Board's formal complaint, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against Jones, the right to present evidence on Jones' behalf, the right to compulsory process to secure the attendance of such witnesses, the right to testify on Jones' own behalf, the right to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the merits of the Board's formal complaint, the right to obtain judicial review of the Board's decision, and the right to appeal any final order of the Board to the Circuit Court as otherwise allowed by KRS 335.550.

Jones understands that by entering into this Agreed Order she waives all of those rights in consideration for the Board's acceptance of this Agreed Order.

### **JURISDICTION**

Jones acknowledges that the Board has jurisdiction over Jones and the conduct which has precipitated this Agreed Order. Jones also acknowledges that the Board has the legal power to take disciplinary action up to and including revocation of Jones' license to practice professional counseling in Kentucky. Jones acknowledges the Board will retain jurisdiction over this matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order have been met to the satisfaction of the Board.

### PUBLICATION

Jones acknowledges that, once adopted by the Board, this Agreed Order is considered a public document, available for inspection at any time by any member of the public under the Kentucky Open Records Act. Further, Jones understands the Board is free to make any use it deems appropriate of the contents of this Agreed Order, which shall include the Board's ability to share the content of this Agreed Order with any governmental or professional board or organization, publication of a summary in the Board's newsletter, reporting under federal law, and availability via the Board's web site.

### **TERMS**

In consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and agreements contained herein, the adequacy and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby covenant and agree as follows:

 Jones shall execute and return a copy of this Agreed Order to the Board within thirty (30) days of receipt of the Agreed Order or it shall be null and void, and the Board may institute further disciplinary action.

- Jones' LPCC license shall be suspended for a period of two years. The suspension shall be probated for the two-year period if:
  - Jones submits to and contracts for supervision by a Board-approved supervisor,
     and that supervisor provides the Board with quarterly reports on Jones' practice
     and professional development; and
  - b. Jones completes three (3) hours of continuing education in professional ethics per year of the probated suspension, at her expense, totaling six (6) hours. This requirement shall be in addition to any other continuing education hour requirements in statute or regulation.
- Jones shall be required to complete personal therapy related to boundary issues, for a period of two years total, with sessions no less often than once per month. Ms. Jones' therapist shall provide to the Board quarterly reports on Ms. Jones' progress in therapy.
- Jones agrees to commit no violations of statutes and regulations governing her license to practice as a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor.
- 5. Upon approval of this Agreed Order by the Board, the Board shall dismiss complaint number 2021-LPC-00003. Any violation by Jones of the terms of this agreement shall be grounds for further action by the Board, including but not limited to the reopening of this complaint.
- 6. Jones agrees to permit and cooperate with the Board, its members, agents, and employees, and its Complaints Committee and representatives, to monitor Jones' compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreed Order. Jones shall sign and file any appropriate authorizations, releases, or both for information that may be requested by the Board or its representatives.

- Jones acknowledges that at all times relevant hereto she has had the opportunity to retain and consult with competent legal counsel of her choosing.
- 8. All parties agree to take all actions necessary that would cause the conditions and obligations under this Agreed Order to become effective upon the effective date of this Agreed Order, or, in the event that additional documents may need to be executed after the effective date of this Agreed Order, the parties agree to cooperate with each other and execute such additional documents to effectuate the purposes as stated herein.

### ACCEPTANCE BY THE BOARD

Jones acknowledges that this Agreed Order, after her execution of same, shall be presented to the Board with a recommendation for approval from the Board's Counsel at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board following receipt of the executed agreement. The Agreed Order shall not become effective until it has been approved by the Board and endorsed by the Chair of the Board. Jones understands the Board is under no obligation to accept or reject this Agreed Order, and hereby waives any right she may have had to challenge, based upon the presentation of this Agreed Order to the Board, the impartiality of the Board to hear an administrative action if this Agreed Order is rejected. If this Agreed Order is rejected by the Board, it shall be regarded as null and void, and of no effect. No statement or term contained in this Agreed Order will be regarded as evidence in any subsequent disciplinary hearing, nor shall any inference be taken from Jones' willingness to enter into this Agreed Order.

### ENFORCEABILITY

All parties and their undersigned representatives warrant and represent that they have the requisite power and authority to enter into this Agreed Order and to effectuate the purposes herein,

and that this Agreed Order shall be legally binding and enforceable against each party in accordance with terms of the Agreed Order.

### EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of this Agreed Order shall be the date it is accepted by the Board and signed by the Chairperson of the Board.

### CHOICE OF LAW, VENUE, AND TRIAL RIGHTS

This Agreed Order shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Any disputes arising under this Agreed Order shall be resolved in the Circuit Court of Franklin County, Kentucky; the parties consent and agree to the *in personam* jurisdiction of such Court. The parties agree that trial of any such litigation shall be by bench trial only, and each party hereby waives its right to jury trial in any dispute arising from this Agreed Order.

### COSTS

The parties shall bear their respective costs.

### MODIFICATION

This Agreed Order may not be altered, amended, or modified except by a written agreement executed by all parties.

### RELEASE OF LIABILITY

Jones and Jones' executors, administrators, successors and assigns hereby release and forever discharge the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Board, and the Public Protection Cabinet, and each of their members, agents, and employees in their individual and representative capacities from any and all manner of actions, causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and unknown, in law or equity, that Jones ever had, now has, may have or claim to have against any or all of the persons or entities named in this paragraph

arising out of or by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this Agreed Order, or its administration.

### ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreed Order embodies the entire agreement between the Board and Jones. This Agreed Order shall constitute a binding contract between Jones and the Board, subject only to approval by the Board as set forth above. Jones shall not rescind, revoke, withdraw, or seek to modify this Agreed Order prior to or during its presentation to the Board at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.
